

Ch → 2 The Subject and Predicate

Every sentence has two parts:

1. Subject Part.
2. Predicate Part.

Definition: A Part of a sentence which denotes the person or thing about which something is said, is called the subject of the sentence.

- Ex 1: Walking is a good exercise.
2. Hari sings a song.
S P

Definition: - A Part of a sentence which tells something about the person or thing denoted by the subject is called the predicate.

- Ex 2: The boys are playing a match.
S P

Note 1: Subject is not used generally in imperative sentences.

- Ex 1: Come here.
2. Thank you.

Note 2: The subject is used generally at the end in exclamatory sentences.

- Ex 1: How cruel he is!

Subject Predicate

(7) The wise hare was the leader of Animals.

⇒ I'm dancing here and they are playing. (Simple)

4. Ravi is ill. He wants to go to school.

⇒ Ravi is ill He wants to go to school. (Compound)

5. Wait here I come.

⇒ Wait here. Until I come
